Ever wonder what being a zookeeper really involves? Discover how our animals are cared for, practice your husbandry skills cleaning an animal habitat, prepare animal diets, create enrichment, and visit behind-the-scenes to see how the zoo really works!

*Both weeks will include the same activities/schedule. We do not allow campers to be signed up for the same theme twice.

**This camp will include hands-on activities or tours in behind-the-scenes areas that may involve dirty and smelly tasks that are often outside and in cramped spaces. These camps require campers to be able to work cooperatively with peers and adults and to be able to follow directions promptly.

Zoology 101

July 1 -5

Ages: 15 - 17

Have you ever thought about a future career working at a zoo? During this week, you'll get a truly hands-on experience! You will be trained to handle one of our ambassador animals, assist in animal care and feeding, contribute to a research project, and help lead an education program on the last day of camp.

*Camp will still be operating on the Fourth of July (7/4).

**Portions of the Zoology 101 summer camp take place with keepers in non-public areas. These campers must be able to work both independently and in small teams with peers to complete a task, follow multi-step directions without repeated prompting, and be able to adapt quickly to changes. Campers must also be able to tolerate exposure to strong smells, loud or sudden noises, hot and humid conditions, tightly enclosed areas, rough terrain, and exposure to potential allergens (hay, wood shavings, fur, etc.).
